Hodges Race. Topped off with boxes of free donuts and refreshments, the event was a morning filled with high energy, high spirits, and just plain fun. The 5K race is held on our celebrated Rail Trail, between the Depot on Church Street and Valley Falls Park.

Meet at the gazebo in the Valley Falls Park parking area. Participants should dress accordingly for each event, being sure to be covered for possible rambles off the trail and into the brush. e like to think of Valley Falls Farm as the most scenic corner in Vernon. The pasture, the red barn, and the iconic stable on the hillside paint a picture unique to our community – and – dare we say, unique in our State. This thinking gave birth to the idea of "Artists Day at Valley Falls Farm". It was the perfect place for artists to create, musicians to play, and visitors to enjoy a balmy summer afternoon. The first event in 2008 drew over 200 people, and it has become a biennial event since that time.

This year's Artists Day at Valley Falls Farm will be held on Sunday, August 20th. The public is invited to stroll through the fields between 1:00 and 3:30 pm, and enjoy the art of the *plein* 

*air* artists painting on the grounds. Other paintings by the artists will be on display in the red barn and will be available for sale. Tours of the historic buildings will be given on the hour, sparked with tales of the intriguing history of the "gentleman farmers" that once owned Valley Falls Farm. Live musicians will play on the porch of the farmhouse during the afternoon, funded by the Vernon Arts Commission. The herb and flower gardens in the old cold frames, planted and tended by the Vernon Garden Club, add to the experience. Mark your calendar - August 20th - for a quintessential summer afternoon experience at Valley Falls Farm!

## Heritage Center Update Adaptive Reuse of the Historic Stable

ork continues on the grant to create a heritage center in the stable at Vallev Falls Farm. We have hired local architect Bob Hurd to help with adaptation of the building for this use. Bob will also work with local building officials and the Town Planning department to determine permitting requirements. As of this writing, an onsite meeting is planned with the local officials this coming week.

The historical integrity of the interior will be retained,

no major changes are planned. Since the heritage center will be open only seasonally, June to October, the installation of a heating system will not be required. Upgrading of the existing electrical, water and bathroom facilities will likely be needed. The horse stalls make excellent areas for displays. We expect completion of the project in the fall of 2018.

### NATURE NOTES -

**R** LOODROOT (Sanguinaria canadensis) is one of the earliest wildflowers to greet

us in the spring. Its white flowers emerge from unfolding leaves. The foliage is lovely and will last all summer and fall. Bloodroot is one of many woodland flowers dispersed by ants who carry the seeds to their nest where they eat the outer covering, then discard the seed in their "compost



pile." The rhizomes contain a red sap which the Native Americans used as a dye. Bloodroot occurs throughout the park and can be seen along the Braille trail.
