

Heritage Center Updates

Our revised Heritage Center
Walking Guide has a new look!

interpretive panels in the outbuildings at the Heritage Center (the red barn, piggery, ice house and manure shed). During Covid he also spent a summer month at the Farm helping to prepare the exhibit areas in the Heritage Center. Thank you once again, Austin, for all your contributions to our Heritage Center.

Heritage Center History - The Tack Room

Walk into the tack room in the stable and you'll be amazed at how many reins, bridles, and brushes were found there when the Friends began cleaning the entire building. Tack rooms are generally built to store equipment needed to groom and ride horses. The tack room in the stable had been left intact with its original paint, so we decided to leave it in this original state as an exhibit for the Heritage Center. Displayed items in the room include an early 20th century telephone that was left

on the wall, leaving us to wonder how it was used there. No evidence of telephone wiring is found.



The stable, with its impressive interior, including four stalls, a carriage room and the tack room, was built by Count Munchow in 1911 for his riding horses. He is remembered in local history books for the impressive image he struck as he rode through the

center of Rockville, perched on his horse and carriage, his Great Dane by his side. He later went into debt and mysteriously disappeared, leaving his wife to clear up the finances. Come visit and learn the whole story!
