



## **Farming Fish at Valley Falls**

In 1871 Christian Sharps purchased the 150-acre farm at Valley Falls for \$9,000. Sharps was chiefly a firearms manufacturer, but also an opportunistic investor. He decided to raise brook trout on the property.

Sharps built his ambitious venture alongside Railroad Brook. Its cold waters were the ideal conditions faising trout. The site is on the **National Register of Historic Places**.

## **The Trout Business**

Raising trout was a new industry in the late 1800s. It held promise of lucrative profit. The naturally cold, spring-fed streams here in the northeast attracted early trout "farmers." The mature trout were sold to restaurants and used to stock fishing sites.

Christian Sharps' operation was large enough to hatch 300,000 trout a year. It was projected to be the largest fish hatchery in the country, with the capacity to produce up to 500,000 fish a year.

Unfortunately, Sharps died before his trout business ever sold a single fish.

## **Christian Sharps in Vernon**

Christian Sharps was famous for the invention of the "Sharps Rifle". The weapon was used in the Civil War and is noted for playing a major role in the victory at Harper's Ferry. He had several arm manufacturing facilities in Connecticut.

Sharps lived on Birch Street in Vernon in a house originally built by the Talcott family, as noted on the bistorical marker on the house. He died suddenly of tuberculosis in 1874. He was 63 years old.
